**A-3 Approval to enter into contractual services with Bestcore Arts and Technology Innovation, Inc. for after school music technology, Javascript coding, and career/entrepreneurship development**

The goal of the program is to provide a pipeline for students to develop cultural and STEM interests through exposure to careers that can lead to future success.

RESOLVED, that the Receiver, acting as the Board of School Directors, approves entering into a contracted services agreement with Chester Education Foundation (CEF) to provide college and career readiness after school activities at Chester High School and STEM during the 2020-21 school year. The programming will support student growth through academic enrichment and post-secondary preparedness activities. The programs will be run in conjunction with the school's administration and staff to help the district uphold its tenets of helping all students achieve. The overall goal of the programming is to prepare CHS and STEM 9th -12th graders for success through high school graduation and into postsecondary enrollment through a holistic, out-of-school -time experience that bolsters their confidence and deepens their commitment to scholastic achievement. The proposed program activities include: academic, college preparation, workforce development and personal/social components. All programs will be presented through Google Classroom, CANVAS and Zoom while virtual.

The Chester Education Foundation will use non-school district funds to support the following: technology purchases, student stipends, and incentive gift cards.

- Valuing social justice for issues that affect our communities: Poverty, Hunger, Crime

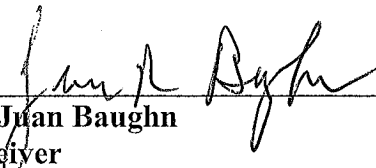
